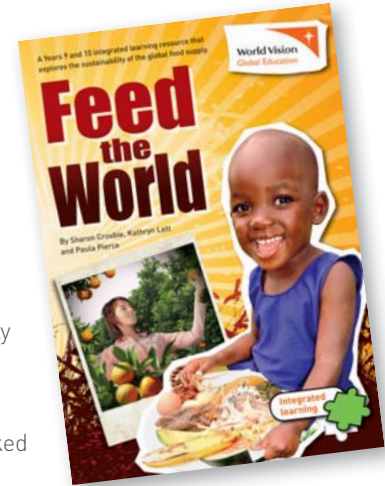


## FEED THE WORLD

The food crisis highlights issues about feeding the world both now and in the future. Is the global food supply sustainable and what will it take to make it so? This CD includes Level 5 curriculum-linked resources to: Debate food crisis related topics (English); Communicate ideas in poster form (Visual Arts); Experience how lack of, or too much, food can affect people's physical competence and participation (Health and PE); Communicate patterns and relationships about feeding the world (Maths); Investigate the ecological interdependence of living things (Science); Understand how people's management of resources impacts on environmental and social sustainability (Social Studies); Develop a porridge that meets the nutritional needs of under-fives (Food Technology).
