Every day we use water; we drink it, wash in it and clean things with it. All we have to do is turn on a tap and we get clean, fresh water. But in many countries getting clean water is not so easy. The water may be stored in a pond or well some distance from where people live and often it is up to the children to walk to collect the water. In many cases the water is not clean and can make the children sick when they drink it.

In your letter to your Worldbuddy why not ask them about where they get their water and how they use it.
